# **District Goal Actions**

- 1: Implement a successful 1:1 **technology** initiative to enhance student learning, instruction, and achievement.
  - Mrs. Boekhout continues to use technology in novel ways. She has taught her first graders to video record themselves on iPads reading and to use the video to monitor themselves for fluency!
  - We are looking forward to see how the updated infrastructure over winter break helps to make the internet more reliable in our classrooms. - Big shout out to Bill and Chris for this!
  - The second grade teachers continue to find new and exciting applications for their students to use on their new chromebooks.
- 2: Increase implementation and alignment of **lowa Common Core** curriculum utilizing Characteristics of Effective Instruction (Student Centered-Teaching for Learner Differences-Assessment for Learning-Rigor and Relevance-Teaching for Understanding).
  - RES teachers have viewed webinars to assess interest in different science curriculums. We will be using their trial login information to pilot units in the classroom to determine alignment with standards and best fit with the instructional shifts in Science. We are exploring curriculum from Amplify Science, Stem Scope, and will continue to use the Mystery Science that has been supported by PTA funding the last year.
  - Jen Burch (K) and Angela Carver (2nd) attended a work day for social studies curriculum to plan units aligned to the new standards and instructional practices along with Jan (Instructional Coach) and Mrs. Fuhrman. We will be rolling out the learning and planning process with teachers in 2nd semester. 2018-19 is the 2nd year for the state's implementation plan which asks districts/teachers to begin planning for implementation of new standards and the instructional shifts.
- 3: Improve **communication** between all stakeholders in the district that will promote an atmosphere that encourages positive relationships.
  - RES staff have completed a teacher walk round for fall semester. Teachers have been able to visit another
    classroom to see a variety of content and teaching strategies. Abby and Jason as part of the TL team at RES acted
    as substitute teachers and also felt it was a great experience from that perspective to see the variety of grades and
    teaching experiences.
  - Our staff began their book study using the book Kids Deserve It by Todd Nesloney and Adam Welcome. We enjoyed
    the kickoff hosted at Jan Tjeerdsma's home (along with a HUGE thank you to his wife Eileen for helping to host us)
    and finished after the PD time with a Christmas get together.
  - We enjoyed December fun with activities for the last 12 days before break. On 12/14/18 we have 46 volunteers
    ranging from PIE partners, community leaders, administration, and groups from the WHS Character Education group
    coming to read stories to our classrooms. We are excited for this opportunity to welcome the visitors to Roosevelt.

# **Other Notes:**

- Our 4th grade will be taking the NAEP assessments in late January. This is a random selection from the federal programs that monitor student achievement.
- We are continuing to work with the committee and Matt on the new school plans. The FFA group is assisting with taking drone video footage of the AM/PM drop off and pick up at both RES and CMS so we can visualize the space needed for parents at those times. We will use those videos in conjunction with planning the best parking areas and traffic flow plans that we can.

# **District Goals:**

# 1. Implement a successful 1:1 technology initiative to enhance student learning, instruction, and achievement.

- **GROW**: Looking at establishing a new grading system at WHS for 2019-2020 school year. We have established a Grading Team where we plan to visit some progressive schools that have incorporated new grading practices. We have a few teachers who will be piloting a scaled homework system (1-4) here at WHS and putting a larger emphasis on formative and summative assessments. Many teachers are using a variety of technology tools to help with grading formative assessments.
- We added a Hyperdoc for WHS lesson plans to all stakeholders in the community to easily access what is happening in classrooms at WHS. This will be highlighted by students in our Student Advisory Group through a screencast in the near future.
- The emphasis at WHS during the 2018-2019 school year is **INNOVATION** We will be finishing up the *Innovator's Mindset* By: George Couros. The book has led to many great conversations that have sparked some innovative ideas happening within classrooms.
- Implementation of the SAMR (Substitution, Augmentation, Modification, and Redefinition) model will be a part of our WHS Building Goals for 2018-2019. Many teachers are working to incorporate technology into their classrooms to enhance and innovate their previous lessons.
- We continue to use the SWIVL camera to record lessons each quarter and reflect on our practice.
- We are excited to have our Breakout Boxes that teachers can check out from library. They will be using these in classes to do 'escape room' lessons and challenge the students with their classroom content in a new and innovative way.

# 2. Increase implementation and alignment of lowa Common Core Curriculum utilizing characteristics of effective instruction.

- Curriculum meetings are on a roll with many great conversations. The Lead Teachers are great at helping establish a
  flowing curriculum K-12 in their departments through the use of our district curriculum outlines. They have also established Team
  Drives that are shared within each department. Many of them have added resources to help colleagues find reputable sources for
  use in the classroom.
- We are working hard to look at Science curriculum as our Science department will be ordering new materials on July 1, 2019.
- Everyone is working on their action plans in support of Teacher Collective Efficacy.
- WHS staff is currently working on their next round of video reflections with IC. These conversations are helping build on the way we're using our standards and incorporating them into our daily lessons.

# 3. Improve communication between all stakeholders in the district that will promote an atmosphere that encourages positive relationships.

- In the mornings at WHS we have had different groups of students volunteer to greet students as they enter the doors. This creates a more friendly and welcoming learning environment with our staff and administrator presence.
- We are excited with the way our TLC program is working at WHS. The newly formatted roles have helped with clarification and consistency among staff here at the high school.
- Our Student Advisory Committee (made up of 5 students per grade level) is working on creating screencast videos to explain key features of our website to stakeholders. They are also working on a quarterly website that they can share with stakeholders (Empowering Learners). This website will highlight the great things happening at WHS.
- Winter Sports are on a roll and off to a great start in their seasons.
- Our Character Development class held a online wreath auction on Facebook which raised \$220 for our local food bank.
- Our WHS Choir students sang at Rotary, Good Times Place and the Christmas Parade downtown. They love being able to sing in the community and share their holiday spirit!

# ROLE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

In this series of the board policy manual, the board defines the role and the employment of school district administrators. Policies in the 400 Series, "Employees," also apply to administrators unless a more specific policy exists in the 300 Series, "Administration."

School district administrators have been given a great opportunity and responsibility to manage the school district, to provide educational leadership, and to implement the educational philosophy of the school district. They are responsible for the day-to-day operations of the school district. In carrying out these operations, the administrators are guided by board policies, the law, the needs of the students, and the wishes of the citizens in the school district community.

It is the responsibility of the administrators to implement and enforce the policies of the board, to oversee employees, to monitor educational issues confronting the school district, and to inform the board about school district operations.

While the board holds the superintendent ultimately responsible for these duties, the principals are more directly responsible for educational results, for the administration of the school facilities and for the employees.

The board and the administration will work together to share information and decisions under the management team concept.

#### **MANAGEMENT**

The board and the administrators will work together in making decisions and setting goals for the school district. This effort is designed to obtain, share, and use information to solve problems, make decisions, and formulate school district policies and regulations.

It is the responsibility of each administrator to fully participate in the management of the school district by investigating, analyzing, and expressing their views on issues. Those board members or administrators with special expertise or knowledge of an issue may be called upon to provide information. Each board member and administrator will support the decisions reached on the issues confronting the school district.

The board is responsible for making the final decision in matters pertaining to the school district.

It is the responsibility of the superintendent to develop guidelines for cooperative decision-making.

#### MANAGEMENT TEAM

The board of education and the administration of the school district believe in and endorse the concept of a "Management Team." The management team includes all members of the board of education and the administrative team. This is an expression of commitment to the belief that participatory management will result in comprehensive and efficient solutions to local education concerns. The management team shall be headed by the School Board President or designee. The president shall convene meetings to discuss district policies, administrative procedures and other business brought to the Management Teams attention.

Decisions made by the Management Team in a collaborative way have more quality due to the inclusion of diverse approaches and greater quantify of informational input.

All members of the management team have the responsibility for exercising full expression during the decision making process which leads to recommendations for school board action on policy matters.

# SUPERINTENDENT QUALIFICATIONS, RECRUITMENT, APPOINTMENT

The board will employ a superintendent to serve as the chief executive officer of the board, to conduct the daily operations of the school district, and to implement board policy with the power and duties prescribed by the board and the law.

The board will consider applicants that meet or exceed the standards set by the Iowa Department of Education and the qualifications established in the job description for the superintendent position. In employing a superintendent, the board will consider the qualifications, credentials and records of the applicants without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability. In keeping with the law, however, the board will consider the veteran status of the applicants. The board will look closely at the training, experience, skill and demonstrated competence of qualified applicants in making its final decision.

In choosing a superintendent, the board will also consider the school district's educational philosophy, financial situation, organizational structure, education programs, and other factors deemed relevant by the board.

The board may contract for assistance in the search for a superintendent.

## SUPERINTENDENT CONTRACT AND CONTRACT NONRENEWAL

The length of the contract for employment between the superintendent and the board is determined by the board. The contract will begin on July 1 and end on June 30. The contract will state the terms of employment.

The first two years of a contract issued to a newly employed superintendent is considered a probationary period. The board may waive this period or the probationary period may be extended for an additional year upon the consent of the superintendent. In the event of termination of a probationary or nonprobationary contract, the board will afford the superintendent appropriate due process, including notice by May 15. The superintendent and board may mutually agree to terminate the superintendent's contract at any time.

If a superintendent's contract is not being renewed by the board, the contract will be extended automatically for additional one-year periods beyond the end of its term until it is modified or terminated as mutually agreed to by the parties or until the superintendent's contract is terminated consistent with statutory termination procedures.

It is the responsibility of the board to provide the contract for the superintendent.

If the superintendent wishes to resign, to be released from a contract, or to retire, the superintendent must comply with board policies dealing with retirement, release or resignation.

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# SUPERINTENDENT SALARY AND OTHER COMPENSATION

The board has complete discretion to set the salary of the superintendent. It is the responsibility of the board to set the salary and benefits of the superintendent at a level that will include consideration of, but not be limited to, the economic condition of the school district and the training, experience, skill, and demonstrated competence of the superintendent. The salary is set at the beginning of each contract term.

In addition to the salary and benefits, the superintendent's actual and necessary expenses are paid by the school district when the superintendent is performing work-related duties. It is within the discretion of the board to pay dues to professional organizations for the superintendent.

The board may approve the payment of dues and other benefits or compensation over and above the superintendent's contract. Approval of dues and other benefits or compensation will be included in the records of the board in accordance with board policy.

#### SUPERINTENDENT DUTIES

The board employs a superintendent of schools to serve as the chief executive officer of the board. The board delegates to the superintendent the authority to implement board policy and to execute decisions made by the board concerning the internal operations of the school district, unless specifically stated otherwise.

The superintendent is responsible for the implementation and execution of board policy and the observance of board policy by employees and students. The superintendent is responsible for overall supervision and discipline of employees and the education program.

In executing the above-stated duties, the superintendent will consider the financial situation of the school district as well as the needs of the students. Specifically, the superintendent:

- Interprets and implements all board policies and all state and federal laws relevant to education;
- Supervises, either directly or through delegation, all activities of the school system according to, and consistent with, the policies of the board;
- Represents the board as a liaison between the school district and the community;
- Establishes and maintains a program of public relations to keep the public well-informed of the activities and needs of the school district, effecting a wholesome and cooperative working relationship between the school district and the community;
- Attends and participates in all meetings of the board, except when the superintendent has been excused, and makes recommendations affecting the school district;
- Reports to the board on such matters as deemed material to the understanding and proper management of the school district or as the board may request;
- Assumes responsibility for the overall financial planning of the district and for the preparation of the annual budget, and submits it to the board for review and approval;
- Establishes and maintains efficient procedures and effective controls for all expenditures of school district funds in accordance with the adopted budget, subject to the direction and approval of the board:
- Files, or causes to be filed, all reports required by law;
- Makes recommendations to the board for the selection of employees for the school district;
- Makes and records assignments and transfers of all employees pursuant to their qualifications;
- Employs such employees as may be necessary, within the limits of budgetary provisions and subject to the board's approval;
- Recommends to the board, for final action, the promotion, salary change, demotion, or dismissal of any employee;
- Prescribes rules for the classification and advancement of students, and for the transfer of students from one building to another in accordance with board policies;
- Summons employees of the school district to attend such regular and occasional meetings as are necessary to carry out the education program of the school district;

## SUPERINTENDENT DUTIES

- Supervises methods of teaching, supervision, and administration in effect in the schools;
- Attends such conventions and conferences as are necessary to keep informed of the latest educational trends:
- Accepts responsibility for the general efficiency of the school system, for the development of the employees, and for the educational growth and welfare of the students;
- Defines educational needs and formulates policies and plans for recommendation to the board;
- Makes administrative decisions necessary for the proper functioning of the school district;
- Responsible for scheduling the use of buildings and grounds by all groups and/or organizations;
- Acts as the purchasing agent for the board, and establishes procedures for the purchase of books, materials and supplies;
- Approves vacation schedules for employees;
- Conducts periodic district administration meetings;
- Performs other duties as may be assigned by the board.
- Supervises the establishment or modification of the boundaries of school attendance and transportation areas subject to approval of the board; and
- Directs studies of buildings and sites, taking into consideration population trends and the educational and cultural needs of the district in order to ensure timely decisions by the board and the electorate regarding construction and renovation projects.

This list of duties will not act to limit the board's authority and responsibility over the superintendent. In executing these duties and others the board may delegate, the superintendent will consider the school district's financial condition as well as the needs of the students in the school district.

#### SUPERINTENDENT EVALUATION

The board will conduct an ongoing evaluation of the superintendent's skills, abilities, and competence. At a minimum, the board will formally evaluate the superintendent on an annual basis. The goal of the superintendent's formal evaluation is to ensure the education program for the students is carried out, promote growth in effective administrative leadership, clarify the superintendent's role, clarify the immediate priorities of the board, and develop a working relationship between the board and the superintendent.

The formal evaluation will be based upon the following principles:

- The evaluation criteria will be in writing, clearly stated and mutually agreed upon by the board and the superintendent. The criteria will be related to the job description and the school district's goals;
- At a minimum, the evaluation process will be conducted annually at a time agreed upon;
- Each board member will have an opportunity to individually evaluate the superintendent, and these individual evaluations will be compiled into an overall evaluation by the entire board;
- The superintendent will conduct a self-evaluation prior to discussing the board's evaluation, and the board as a whole will discuss its evaluation with the superintendent;
- The board may discuss its evaluation of the superintendent in closed session upon a request from the superintendent and if the board determines its discussion in open session will needlessly and irreparably injure the superintendent's reputation; and,
- The individual evaluation by each board member, if individual board members so desire, will not be reviewed by the superintendent. Board members are encouraged to communicate their criticisms and concerns to the superintendent in the closed session. The board president will develop a written summary of the individual evaluations, including both the strengths and the weaknesses of the superintendent, and place it in the superintendent's personnel file to be incorporated into the next cycle of evaluations.

This policy supports and does not preclude the ongoing, informal evaluation of the superintendent's skills, abilities and competence.

# SUPERINTENDENT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The board encourages the superintendent to continue professional growth by being involved in professional organizations, attending conferences, continuing education, and participating in other professional activities.

It is the responsibility of the superintendent to arrange the superintendent's schedule in order to enable attendance at various conferences and events. If a conference or event requires the superintendent to be absent from the office for more than three days, requires overnight travel, or involves unusual expense, the superintendent will bring it to the attention of the board president prior to attending the event.

The superintendent will report to the board after an event.

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## SUPERINTENDENT CIVIC ACTIVITIES

The board encourages the superintendent to be involved in the school district community by belonging to school district community organizations and attending and participating in school district community activities.

It is the responsibility of the superintendent to become involved in school district community activities and events. The board may include a lump sum amount as part of the superintendent's compensation to be used specifically for paying the annual fees of the superintendent for school district community activities and events if, in the board's judgment, the superintendent's participation will further the public purpose of promoting and deriving support for the school district and public education in general. It is within the discretion of the board to pay annual fees for professional organizations and activities.

#### SUPERINTENDENT CONSULTING/OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

The superintendent is considered a full-time employee. The board expects the superintendent to give the responsibilities of the position precedence over other employment. The superintendent may accept consulting or outside employment for pay as long as, in the judgment of the board, the work is conducted on the superintendent's personal time and it does not interfere with the performance of the superintendent's duties.

The board reserves the right, however, to request that the superintendent cease the outside employment as a condition of continued employment. The board will give the superintendent thirty days notice to cease outside employment.
