WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL Return to Learn Plan

Priorities

- CCSD will be returning to school for face-to-face instruction to begin the year. Depending on the number of cases in our county this could lead to hybrid or online (taught by CCSD staff) at some point during the school year.
- Learning will be mainly focused around prioritized content within the Iowa Core Curriculum.
- Learning opportunities are provided Monday through Friday and are based on the CCSD academic calendar.
- Staff will track student participation, attendance and progress (grades, online activity, etc.) via JMC.
- Staff is expected to communicate with students/parents/guardians accordingly.
- Staff is expected, within reasonable means, to meet guidelines associated with IEP and Section 504.
- Families are encouraged to communicate with staff.
- In the event of district-wide online or hybrid learning, students may have the option for both online and off-line learning activities. Packets may be necessary or provided by staff to meet the diverse learning needs of our students.
- The primary tools for communication between teachers and families will be Google Classroom, Zoom or Google Meet, online textbooks, student email addresses, and parent provided email addresses.
- Core and Support staff may provide learning in the event of online or hybrid learning. Lessons may be recorded for accountability and/or made available to students to watch at any time.

Masks	 Please bring your own mask Masks are strongly encouraged in spaces and situations where 6' social distancing cannot occur; for example in hallways, small group work, labs, etc. If students do not have a mask they may contact the school and one will be provided
Before & After School	 Designated entrances (JR/SR = auditorium, FR/SO = gym) Students go directly to their 1st period classroom, a classroom for before school help, the commons or library rather than hallways If students are eating breakfast they must spread out in the commons and then report to 1st period immediately when finished (no more than 2 per table) At the end of the day students will be dismissed by classrooms in staggered increments
Hallways	 We ask that students go directly from one class to the next, eliminating unnecessary stops Students can carry chromebook bags with essential supplies and a water bottle Masks are strongly encouraged in the hallways Students with health conditions (or others with concerns of student traffic between passing periods) will be allowed to pass a minute or two early

WHS In-Person Plans:

 Every class will have assigned seating charts for students Students and teachers will wipe doors, desks and chairs at the end of each period Larger classes may be using the outdoors, auditorium, commons, library, gym lobby, etc. depending on availability Sanitizing materials, provided by the district, will be available in all classrooms Textbooks will be sanitized if used by multiple students or kept for 72 hours between students, online textbooks are the preferred and recommended method this year Masks are highly encouraged where physical distancing cannot be maintained
 Students will eat in the commons, library and conference room spaced out 6' from one another Commons doors will be propped open and marked for entrance (West) and exit (East) Hand Sanitizer will be available
 Water Bottles allowed for all students - no drinking fountains will be available Students can refill water bottles using the water bottle filling stations
 All teachers will be using Google Classroom at WHS Online learning procedures with Google Classroom, guidelines and code of conduct will be taught in every class during the first weeks of school (in the event that we would have to go to Hybrid or Online learning) Online textbooks will be used when applicable Teacher designed pre-assessments will be done at the beginning of the school year to determine where each student is academically to address gaps in learning from the spring
 All equipment will be sanitized between uses Teachers will limit the number of students in the locker room at one time Activities will be planned to be as socially distant as possible
 Books will be quarantined for 72 hours after being returned before they can be checked out again The layout of the library will be altered to accommodate for social distancing
 Rehearsal spaces will be spread out to be as socially distant as possible Individually scheduled lessons will still take place throughout the day Directors will assist each other in supervision of either large/small groups during their rehearsal periods
